Waikanae Music Society favourites, Amici Ensemble, are joined by pianist Jian Liu to kick off the 2021 season. This year, with Jian, they are an ensemble of six players, performing in a variety of combinations. We love their joyous music-making and brilliant programming and look forward to a grand start to the year.

## THE PERFORMERS:

THE AMICI ENSEMBLE: Donald Armstrong (violin) leads the Amici Ensemble – a group of top performers from the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra, in which Donald is Associate Concertmaster. Donald is joined this year by Malavika Gopal (violin), Andrew Thompson (violin and viola), Julia Joyce (viola) and Andrew Joyce (cello).

PIANIST JIAN LIU: Jian was accepted at the prestigious Central Conservatory of Music in Beijing at the age of 12. He moved to the United States when he was 15, and promptly won first place at the 6th Missouri Southern International Competition in 1996. Since then, Jian has been honoured at a number of competitions, performed widely around the world, and amongst his numerous qualifications has completed a Master of Musical Arts at the Yale School of Music. Jian is Head of Piano Studies and Programme Director of Classical Performance at the New Zealand School of Music. He is also the founding pianist of Te Kōkī Trio, the resident trio there.
